Welcoming Jesus

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock"-Revelation 3:20

A young person goes into their room, and slams the door. They are not coming out. And they want nobody to come in. Not long after the initial tantrum, music gets turned up. You stand at the door. But it is clear. You are not welcome in. Nobody is welcome in. The kid just wants to pout and be left alone. You knock. You stand at the door. Nobody comes to let through the door. Doors play a bigger role in our lives than we care to admit. Doors are thresholds. When we walk through a door, we enter into a different environment. Doors grant us entry into clubs and sanctuaries. Doors keep us safe inside homes and cars. In order to get into most homes, most businesses, and schools, you walk through a door.

Sometimes, it is hard to get through doors. When I go to my daughter's school, I have to press a doorbell, be viewed by the camera, and be authorized to walk through the door. When I go shopping on Black Friday, I have to wait for the doors to be open before I can go in.

In the verse mentioned above, Jesus says that he is standing outside of a church, waiting to be invited in. The people, I assume, sing praises in Christ's name, and meet as folks who say they follow him. Yet, Jesus is locked out, longing to be allowed in to share his life with this church, longing to be known and heard, but unwilling to force his way in.

Are you welcoming Jesus into your life? Is he welcome at your table? Is he welcome to accompany you to work? Are you opening the door to Jesus to speak to you about your marriage, and your free time? Or are you shutting doors in your life to him?

Are you welcoming Jesus through extending welcome in your life to people who seem other than you? Perhaps they come from a different background or different life experiences. Perhaps you are seeking to welcome others into our nation and community that others want to push away. Remember, Matthew 25 says that when we welcomed the least of these, we welcome Jesus.






Refreshing our Spirit through Food 2019 WOMEN'S FALL RETREAT
